


#### CLUB PURPOSE

The mission of the club is to enhance and foster a positive image to the global community by promoting the contribution of the petroleum, energy and allied industries through education by using all resources available.





Subject: Proposed amendments to the ADDC Bylaws and Standing Rules

This is to confirm that the two (2) proposed amendments to the ADDC Bylaws and Standing Rules were adopted at the 59<sup>th</sup> Annual ADDC Convention in Houston, Texas, on Saturday, September 25, 2010. The vote on Amendment No. 1 was 40 for and 14 against. The vote for Amendment No. 2 was 52 for and 2 against.

The following changes need to be made to the ADDC Bylaws and Standing Rules:

Article VII – Dues and Fees, Section 1. (a) Annual dues payable to the Association by each club shall be Forty-Five Dollars (\$45) in U.S. funds for each member of such club.

#### Standing Rule 8:

B. Promotional and Gift Items. The Association guidelines must be followed for all promotional and gift items bearing the ADDC logo or ADDC name in any manner.

Specific, but not all inclusive, requirements include:

- Any club contemplating a promotional or gift item should ensure that such project is in the best interest of the Association and will not injure the image and dignity of Desk and Derrick.
- b. Any such item and accompanying printed materials bearing the words "Desk and Derrick," "D&D", "Association of Desk and Derrick Clubs," "ADDC," and/or the trademark (insignia) must receive Association Board approval by application through regional directors.

#### **NOVEMBER 2010**

In case you missed our report at convention, the purpose of this committee is to assist clubs in promoting education. One of the ways this is accomplished is through the media library at the Association Distribution Office (ADO). Did you know there are roughly 100 videos and/or DVDs on energy subjects like horizontal drilling, synthetic crude, natural gas hydrates, bioremediation, geothermal energy and environmental stewardship? Personal development topics include time management, public speaking and leadership. The complete list of titles can be found on the ADDC website within the Forms Book page, under the Members Only tab. I encourage your club to take advantage of these resources, especially if you've having trouble finding speakers for your monthly program meetings.

Another method of education designed for children was recently approved by the ADDC Board and displayed at convention. The "Circle of Energy" project developed by committee member Sharon Hiss promotes the importance of energy, how petroleum shapes our lives, and how we can be good stewards of the earth.

The project features a poster from the U.S. Department of Energy (Office of Fossil Energy) glued to a tri-fold foam board (from WalMart or any office supply store); lesson plans that correspond with the information on the board; and a craft project - an "energy bracelet" made with a piece of string and colored beads that represent oil, water, soil, people, fuels, petroleum products and the environment. The lesson plans follow this letter and the corresponding poster can be obtained by contacting Trudy Transtrum at 202-586-7253 or emailing trudy.transtrum@hq.doe.gov. Be sure to mention that you are a Desk and Derrick member and you'd like the publication "Petroleum and the Environment", AGI Environmental Awareness Series, which includes a poster. Desk and Derrick is authorized to use these posters for this project, but cannot reproduce or deface them in any way.

If you don't have the time to make the presentation yourself, get the poster board and lesson plan to teachers/educators in your area and ask them to use it when they can – possibly on Earth Day or another special occasion. If you have additional questions, please email SharonHiss@hotmail.com.

In closing, I'd like to ask that you keep your eyes and ears open for new material to add to our library. Does your company have a video or DVD they would consider donating to our library? Are you aware of an educational website that would be of interest and value to our members? If so, <u>please let me know</u> so we can continue to update our library and educate our members, our communities, and our world.

#### Circle of Energy

I want to talk to you about the importance of energy, how we can be a good friend to planet earth and how petroleum shapes our lives.

There are many ways we can protect planet earth every day, because planet earth has given us energy and products we use daily.

So let's celebrate this amazing EARTH and learn what it has provided us (OPTIONAL) by making an energy bracelet. (NOTE: If you don't want to make an energy bracelet, hold up colored circles as you review the numbered items below.)

#### STEPS FOR MAKING THE ENERGY BRACELET

Have a small bag ready with the following colors of beads, along with string and spacing beads if desired. Instruct the children to tie a knot in one end of the string and begin the presentation.

- 1. GLEAR (People)
- 2. BROWN (Soil)
- 3. BLACK (Petroleum / Oil)
- 4. BLUE (Ocean / Water)
- 5. ORANGE (Natural Gas / Propane)
- 6. YELLOW (Transportation Fuels)
- 7. GREEN (Petroleum Products)
- 8. WHITE (Environment)

We will string the beads in a certain order and each color of bead stands for something that is VERY IMPORTANT relating to energy.

- 1. CLEAR People, that is YOU and ME, act as guardians and stewards of the earth. We look after everything on the planet earth.
- BROWN Soil is made from the decomposing of animals and plants when they die. New soil is constantly being made. Heat, rain, and cold weather breaks down decomposing animals, plants and rock particles. Below the soil are layers of sand, silt and rocks.

- 3. BLACK Petroleum is a fossil fuel. Petroleum is often called crude oil or oil. It is called fossil fuel because it was formed from the remains of tiny sea plants and animals that died millions of year ago. The enormous heat and pressure turned them into oil and gas. Petroleum deposits are locked in porous rocks almost like water is trapped in a sponge. Today, we drill down through layers of sand, silt and rock to reach the rock formation that contains the oil and gas deposits. Petroleum is called a non-renewable energy source because to takes millions of years to form.
- 4. BLUE While drilling in the ocean, the petroleum industry works very hard to protect the environment. The workers are very careful not to cause danger to fish, seals, dolphins or reefs. We care about the ocean and the waters and want to keep them safe, beautiful and alive.
- ORANGE Natural gas and propane are both fossil fuels formed like oil deep under the soil. Homes use natural gas and propane for heating, hot water, cooking and also fueling the BBQ grill.
- 6. YELLOW Fuels provide us with different forms of transportation every day. Our automobiles operate by use of gasoline. Trains operate by use of diesel fuel and air planes use jet fuel. All of these fuels are products made from oil.
- GREEN There are many other products made from petroleum. Each day people
  use products that are made from petroleum including crayons, glue, balloons, paint
  brushes, plastics, DVDs, shampoo, frisbees, ink, sunglasses, medicine, and car
  tires.
- 8. WHITE People recognize the need to wisely manage both our dwindling petroleum resources and natural environment. Conservation and recycling programs can extend the life of these resources for future generations and reduce wastes that impact the environment.

Now let's tie a knot in the end of the bracelet to keep all the beads in place. These eight beads represent different elements on earth that allow us to enjoy life everyday. It is a complete cycle that is dependent upon the other components. Every time you wear your bracelet you'll be reminded of the Circle of Energy.
