

Quality Emergency Response Logistics

The best way to describe this company is to call it "The Party Planners of Disasters," although, they do party planning for private and community functions that are non disaster related.

BASE Logistics is a company the majority of its clients hope to be hired only for celebratory events. Unfortunately this is not always the case. In the event of disasters, its personnel goes into the affected areas working with the local companies it has contracted to get life back to normal as quickly as possible. Prior to the event, they make preparations for incoming set up companies and utilities from around the country to be within a few hours driving distance of the pending disaster area.

Started in 1997 by Westbank businessmen, BASE Logistics is located in Harvey, Louisiana. Work contracts take it to all states in the continental United States. Its mission is to develop and implement world class logistical strategies, which enable its customers to quickly and effectively respond to emergency events. Their core business is in the electric utility industry. It counts several of the largest producers and distributors of commercial and residential electricity as customers. It also supports governmental agencies with managing emergency situations.

Invested in state of the art technology and trained experienced personnel, it is able to provide high quality, cost effective services.

Since its beginning, their personnel and a workforce exceeding 155,000 have provided the logistics support before, during and through the area's restoration period. From 200 to 2,000 plus, BASE can handle the needs.

They handle events such as hurricanes, tropical storms, floods, tornadoes, wind, rain, ice and hail storms, as well as spills and environmental disasters. Three most well known disasters, not only in the US but around the world, were Hurricanes Sandy and Katrina and the BP oil spill.

Through its mobile incident command center and modular office units it provides all the things necessary for the staging sites to do consulting for RFP preparation. Catering - breakfasts, box lunches and dinners, which has served more than 5.5 million meals. Ice in excess of 9.3 million pounds, bottled water, soft and sports drinks. Lodging – tables, chairs, bunk trailers and floored sleep tents with cots, air mattresses, linens and sleeping bags in areas like the New Orleans Superdome. Transportation – individual vehicles and buses, golf carts, potable water trucks and fuel stations. Generators - to run electric tower lights, heating units, fans, air conditioners and refrigeration storage equipment. Hygiene - la undry, restroom and washroom facilities, trash receptacles and disposable work kits These are just a few of the hundreds of necessities required by the workforce so they can work the sixteen hour days necessary to get life back to normal.

Response time is within twenty-four hours, or as soon as the weather service calls "all clear" and roads are passable.

It does take a national village to recover from disasters.
