




President's Message

- Judge's Instructions, with a Description of each category (1) for each judge
- Contest Rules, one for each Judge
- A spreadsheet detailing the entries from each club
- A spreadsheet to compile your Judges scores

NET POWER SELECTS ZACHRY GROUP TO BUILD UTILITY-SCALE CLEAN POWER PLANT—PRESS RELEASE

Posted: April 11, 2023

NET Power is pleased to announce it has selected Zachry Group, a leader in engineering and construction services, to provide Front-End Engineering Design (FEED), followed by Engineering, Procurement, and Construction (EPC) services for the construction of NET Power's initial utility-scale power plant, which will be the world's first large-scale gas-fired power facility with near-zero emissions.

4/17/2023 - Mad Dog Phase 2 Centerpiece in Gulf of Mexico Starts Oil Production - BP has announced that it has started oil production at the Argos offshore platform in the Gulf of Mexico. In a statement posted on its website, the company noted that the move delivers "more energy at a critical time" and strengthens BP's position "as a leading producer in the deepwater U.S. Gulf of Mexico". BP highlighted in the statement that Argos is the company's fifth platform in the Gulf of Mexico and its first new operated production facility in the region since 2008. Argos has a gross production capacity of up to 140,000 barrels of oil per day and will increase BP's gross operated production capacity in the Gulf of Mexico by an estimated 20 percent, according to the company, which said it expects to "safely and systematically ramp up production from Argos through 2023". 4/14/2023 - BOEM Adjusts Limit of Liability for Oil Spills in Federal Waters from Offshore Facilities - Increase needed to keep pace with inflation. The Bureau of Ocean Energy Management (BOEM) will administratively increase the limit of liability for oil spill related damages from \$137.66 million to \$167.8 million for offshore oil and gas facilities. The inflation adjustment is mandated by the Oil Pollution Act of 1990 (OPA) and is based on the increase in the Consumer Price Index (CPI) that has occurred over the six years between 2016 and 2022. The increase is needed to keep pace with inflation and will go into effect 30 days after publication in the Federal Register. Read Full Article


4/4/2023 - New OPEC+ Cuts Will Push Oil to \$110 This Summer - If fully delivered, the newly announced OPEC+ cuts would further tighten an already fundamentally tight oil market, drive Brent towards \$100 per barrel sooner than previously expected and push the price to around \$110 per barrel this summer. That's according to Rystad Energy Senior Vice President Jorge Leon, who highlighted in an extraordinary market update sent to Rigzone that the voluntary cut of 1.15 million barrels per day surprised markets, caused oil prices to rise and fed inflationary fears. 4/3/2023 - Biden doubles down on green energy as OPEC cuts production, prices soar - President Biden is doubling down on his push for an economy-wide transition to clean energy sources like wind and solar even as energy prices soar in response to global fossil fuel production cuts. On Monday, after the Organization of the Petroleum Exporting Countries (OPEC) announced massive oil production cuts, the White House issued a joint statement with the European Union reaffirming that clean energy adoption is critical for enhancing energy security. 4/1/2023 - New GOM Lease Sale Reflects Need for Finalized Leasing Program - Gulf of Mexico Lease Sale 259 reflects the need for a finalized leasing program, the National Ocean Industries Association (NOIA) said in a statement sent to Rigzone following the conclusion of the sale. "Lease Sale 259 is the first Gulf of Mexico offshore oil and gas lease sale since November 2021," NOIA President Erik Milito said in the statement. "Mandated by the Inflation Reduction Act, which was signed into law by President Biden, Lease Sale 259 and the resumption of Gulf of Mexico oil and gas lease sales has been needlessly overdue," he added. Pineapple Cheesecake Bars

Ingredients

Cheesecake Bars

- can (8 oz) refrigerated Pillsbury™ Original Crescent Dough Sheet
- 2 packages (8 oz each) cream cheese, softened
- 1/2 cup granulated sugar
 - 2 eggs
 - 1 can (20 oz) pineapple tidbits in juice, drained and juice reserved

Brown Sugar Glaze and Toppings

- 4 tablespoons butter
- 1/2 cup packed brown sugar
- 1/2 cup heavy whipping cream
 - teas poon vanilla
 Whipped topping, maraschino cherries, if desired

Steps

- 1 Heat oven to 375°F. Spray bottom only of 13x9-inch pan with cooking spray. Unroll dough sheet, and press in bottom of pan. Bake 11 to 13 minutes or until light golden brown and baked through. Remove from oven to cooling rack; cool 10 minutes. Reduce oven temperature to 325°F.
- 2 In medium bowl, beat cream cheese and granulated sugar with electric mixer on medium speed until smooth, scraping down side of bowl frequently. Add eggs, 1 at a time, beating until just blended. Add 1/3 cup of the reserved pineapple juice to cream cheese mixture; beat until mixed well. Finely chop 1/2 cup of the pineapple tidbits, and stir into cream cheese mixture. Cover and refrigerate any remaining pineapple tidbits for serving. Spread filling evenly over baked crust. Bake 25 to 30 minutes or until filling is set; cool 30 minutes on cooling rack. Refrigerate about 1 hour or until cooled completely.
- 3 When bars are almost completely cooled, in 11/2-quart saucepan, melt butter over medium heat. Add brown sugar; cook 4 to 6 minutes, stirring frequently, until sugar dissolves. Reduce heat to low; carefully stir in whipping cream and vanilla. Return heat to medium, and heat to simmering. Cook 1 to 3 minutes, stirring constantly, until mixture is thickened. Cool 30 minutes before serving.
- 4 To serve, cut bars into 6 rows by 4 rows. Drizzle cooled brown sugar glaze on top of cheesecake bars, and top with remaining pineapple tidbits. Garnish with whipped topping and maraschino cherry.
